Training Program Schedules

In general, the following outlines the daily routine at Eagle Ranch Kennels (ERK). It can vary based on weather, training progress, etc. but it does serve as a guide to share what a typical day looks like. We follow this same routine for both ERK's dogs and client dogs.

Every dog gets two days off from formal training per week. However, development and obedience skills are practiced every day as a part of the normal daily routine.

Boarding

• ERK has two, climate-controlled kennel facilities that house ERK 's dogs and client's dogs that are with us for training. This is where the dogs sleep and eat their meals. They are cleaned as follows:

- Full daily cleaning of each kennel run.
- Spot clean/washout of each kennel run each time the dogs are let out.
- o Terminal cleaning of each run weekly.

Health Maintenance

- Preventative medications such as worm preventative, flea & tick preventative, or any prescription medications will be given in accordance with the schedule provided by the owner.
- Eagle ranch kennels will provide weekly nail checks and trims for all dogs during their stay.

Owner Communications:

- Weekly reports ERK will provide each owner with a weekly training report via email to communicate activities for the week, activities coming up for the next week, and overall progress towards training goals.
- Owner visits ERK welcomes owner visits to the kennel by appointment to visit with their dogs. It is recommended that owners wait until 30-45 days into the program before scheduling a visit.

Training Program Policies:

- Puppy Age ERK will not accept dogs for training before the age of 6 months old.
- Program Duration ERK's basic level training program is no less that 3 months in length with a potential 4th month depending on the progress of each individual dog.
- Drop off day ERK and the owner will schedule a drop off day to begin training. At that
 time, the dogs will be checked in, training goals will be reviewed/confirmed, and the dog
 will be given a chance to explore and get used to his/her new surroundings before the
 owner goes home.
- Health Records To keep all dogs healthy and happy, ERK requires that all dogs coming
 for training be current on core vaccinations, heart worm negative, intestinal worm
 negative, on worm preventative, on flea & tick preventative, etc. A copy of the health
 records reflecting this should be provided by the owner on the drop off day.
- Food ERK feeds Eukanuba Premium Performance Sport 30/20. We will transition all training dogs to this food unless the owner wishes to provide his or her food of choice for Eagle Ranch Kennels to use during his or her dog's stay.
- Send home day When each dog's training program is complete and it is time to go home, ERK will schedule a send home visit where the owner comes and has an opportunity to handle his or her dog while reviewing all skills learned during training. The owner will then be sent home with a que sheet to maintain consistency in training after the dog goes home.

Training Program Terms:

The following outlines the monthly fees associated with a basic level training program at ERK. We strive to keep this as affordable as possible but must take into consideration all expenses associated with managing a dog at our kennel. These fees are current through 2025.

	Expense Item	Description	Monthly Fee
1	Boarding	Dog food, staff time, health maintenance, etc.	\$150
2	Training	Training plan, staff time, etc.	\$350
3	Training Birds	Pigeons, chukar, quail, etc. (\$12.50 per bird)	\$100
4	Hunt Testing	Entry fees (4 JH braces), travel fees, etc.	\$100

• A \$350 non-refundable deposit is due at the time training is booked. This deposit will be applied to the first month's training fee, which is due on drop off day. The owner will be billed monthly for the remaining months of the training program.

• The owner is responsible for any expenses over and above those included in the training program (unplanned vet expenses, additional birds, etc.). ERK will obtain approval from the owner before incurring said expenses.

Training Program Expectations and Outcomes

- The single most important thing with any training program is to set realistic expectations. ERK's objectives are to meet the goals of every program at the highest level possible.
- The overarching training philosophy of ERK is to
 - a. <u>Train to the potential of the dog.</u> While GSP's all have similar inherent traits, no two dogs are alike. Each has its own strengths and weaknesses. Every dog will learn and ultimately perform to his or her natural abilities. Temperament, confidence, desire to train, hunt drive, genetics, etc. all play a role in the pace of learning and the achievement/advancement of skills.
 - b. Achieve progress and not perfection. There is no such thing as the perfect dog. We can certainly strive for perfection but ultimately it is ERK's belief that perfection does not exist for dogs (or people). Therefore, it is the program's focus to achieve progress every day such that the goals can be achieved at the highest level possible.
 - c. <u>Focus on natural development</u>. Consistently performing GSP's are "developed" not "trained". Our approach is to "bring out" and sharpen the natural abilities that are bred into the dog vs. a forced compliance approach. We strive to work with the dog at his/her stage of development and maturity to improve skills over time.
 - d. <u>Establish a foundation for lifelong learning</u>. Skill mastery cannot be achieved in a single three-month training program. It is a life-long process. Our basic level training program is designed to expose the dog (and the owner) to developmental techniques that get beginner level results but moreover, can be carried forward to more advanced training as the dog matures.
